CURRICULUM VITAE JEANNE OPGENHAFFEN (°1938)

Born in Nieuwkerken-Waas, Belgium, 1938. Working and living in Antwerp, Belgium.

Opgenhaffen followed a bachelor's degree plastic arts before studying ceramics at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and the National Higher Institute of Antwerp.

She started with figurative sculptures in terracotta, inspired by pre-Columbian art. In the early 1990s, she realized others were working too close to a style and she decided to draw a line under this production. At that time, Israeli collectors invited her to visit them again. She accepted the invitation and discovered the Negev desert, dry and full of minerals. Back home she created two new works strongly influenced by what she saw (Timma Valley, 1992 presented at the Lineart in Ghent). These wall panels are covered with porcelain slats in degraded shades reminiscent of the Negev. The fragments are arranged in a smooth way to display the fragment of an immense panorama on a small scale.

Opgenhaffen draws her inspiration from nature, from grandiose sites, from plant structures, from colors and from the power of the elements of nature, without looking at a photographic reproduction of a landscape.

During another trip, she saw the same place again, but she no longer recognized the place. Her imagination had changed it. The artist has transcribed the memory of a sensory experience and not the exact topography of the place. These works are very successful with collectors and museums (The Search for Green, 1994 Museum of Fine Arts, Taipei, Taiwan).

"She is fascinated by the movement of water through the selection, the strength, the way it always looks for and this own way. In 'Power of Running Water' she tries to capture the moving water into strips whitish blue porcelain. In addition to water, wind is also a landscape determining force. In 'A Breeze Blows Over it' are the images captured in their vibrating motion. in 'Green' push the porcelain plates and two large tectonic plating gently but firmly against each other. You see the mountain range born." Bie Luysaert, 2008.
